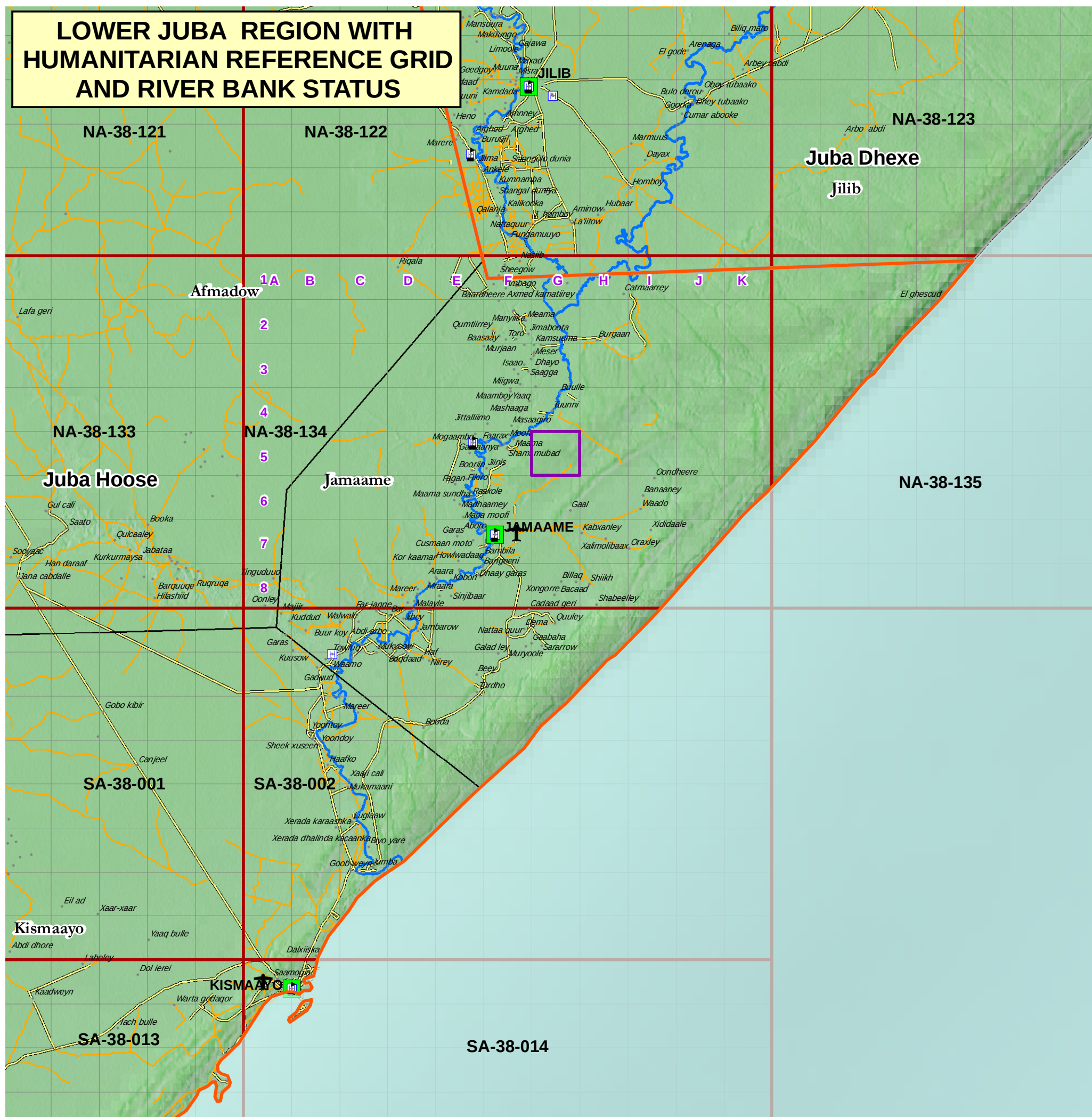


LOWER JUBA REGION WITH HUMANITARIAN REFERENCE GRID AND RIVER BANK STATUS

ENGLISH USING THE REFERENCE GRID TO REPORT LOCATIONS

The grid divides Somalia in to 404 rectangles each corresponding to the internationally recognized topographic map files.

Each of these rectangles is given a unique alpha-numeric reference number. Each of these rectangles is then sub-divided in to 80 square cells, 10 across and 8 down. Each square cell is approximately 5 km by 5km, representing an area of 25 square km. The square cells are referenced from A to K horizontally and from 1 to 8 vertically.

To report your position:

-Locate the square cell you are in on the map using estimated distance and direction from a known point such as a Clinics, schools or settlements as a guide.

-Note that the alpha-numeric rectangle code (e.g. NA-38-134)

-Note the Numeric reference of the square cell

-Note the Alphabetic reference of the square cell.

-When reporting your position, quote the full grid reference by combining the two references (e.g. NA-38-134-5G).

ADEEGSIGA XARIIQDA AMA CALAAMADA TIXRAACA (REFERENCE GRID) EE SAHASHA AQOONSIGA HALKA AMA BARTA LA DOONAYO SI LOO TEBIYO MEELAHA AMA GOOBABA

Xariiqda shabaqa ah (Grid) waxay Soomaaliya u qeybisaa 404 leydiiyood (afar-geesle dhinacyo isla'eg) oo mid walba lagu arkayo khariirada caalamiga ah ee la aqoonsan yahay ee khuseysa oogada sare ee dhulka.

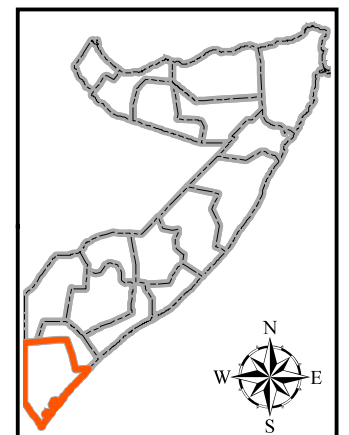
Mid kasta oo ka mid ah leydiiyada waxuu leeyahay ama loo bixiyay magac u gaar ah oo ka sameysan tixraac tiro iyo xarfo isku dhafan (alpha-numeric reference). Mid kasta oo ka mid ah leydiiyada waxaa loo sii kala qeybiyay qolol yar yar oo afargeesle isla'eg oo 80 qol ka kooban (80 square cells), toban (10) ka mid ah waxay u yaalan gudub (across), 8 ka mid ahna hoos.

Qol kasta oo yar oo afartisa dhinac isla'eg waxuu qiyaas ahaan yahay 5km x 5km, badkuna waa 25km². Qolalkaan yar yar waxuu tixraacooda ka bilowdaa A kuna dhamaada K jilf ahaan (horizontal) dhanka kalana waa 1 illaa iyo 18 joog ahaan (vertical).

Si aad u sheegto halka aad joogto:

-Meelee marka hore qolka afargeeska aad ka joogto khariirada adigoo adeegsanaya masaafo qiyaasan iyo jihadda aad ka joogto meel la yaqaan sida Cusbitalo, dugsi ama meelo la degan yahay si ay kuugu noqdaan hagge.

-Xususnow ama eeg calaamadda (koodh-ka leydigga) ee ka sameysan tiro iyo xarfo isku dhafan (tusaale ahaan NA-38-134).
-Xususnow ama eeg tixraaca tirrada qol-ka afargeesoodka (square cell).
-Xususnow ama eeg tixraaca xarfaha uu leeyahay qolka afar-geesoodka ah.
-Marka aad soo tebineysa ama aad sheegeysa halka aad joogto, soo xiggo xariiqda ama grid-ka oo buuxa (dhameystiran) adigoo isu raacinaya labadda tixraac (sida, NA-38-134-5G)
